We had three classes where everyone joined in to judge their favourite exhibit. We also gave away plug plant pelargoniums for members to grow on and bring back to the Summer show where we can all vote for the best. Hopefully they are developing well, don't worry about using an 8" pot, some need more space! Congratulation to Susan Scullard who won the **photo competition** with blossom and bluebells, and Jenny Mitchell's duck photo was so cute. The list of winners is on the website.







Our summer show is on 13 July, check your schedule or our website for details and make a note in your diary to plan your entries the weekend before. We have a 'Tips for Showing' guide on our website (or from the Show secretary) and it really is very simple and great fun to enter something from your garden, or perhaps some cookery?

A few key things that you might be wondering about:

- If there is more than one item in a class (eg five carrots), then consistency of size and shape is really important.
- Size should be appropriate for the item, and not necessarily the biggest!
- Keep the roots or stalks on, e.g. roots on lettuces & cabbages and stalks on raspberries.
- Onions are shown 'as grown' in the summer, so don't trim them, but do clean the roots and present them tidily. In the Autumn show they are trimmed and tied neatly.

Don't forget to send your **potato in a bucket** crop weight with one photo to our **email by 5 July**, and bring your pelargoniums to the show.
